## WellMed Charitable Foundation presents \$125,000 to nine Corpus Christi charities

WellMed Charitable Foundation presented several Corpus Christi charities with donations totaling \$125,000.

The foundation also contributes to caregiver support services in the Coastal Bend and half the operating budget for the Zavala Senior Community Center, which it operates in partnership with the City of Corpus Christi.
