





WCF recognizes Ace Washington for work with Texas Ramp Project

On Feb. 12, WellMed employees volunteered with the Texas Ramp Project to help an older adult in need. It was also a chance to celebrate Ace Washington's remarkable seven years of service to the non-profit organization that provides free wheelchair ramps for disabled and older persons. Many ramp builds benefit our WellMed patients.

Not only has Ace participated in these builds himself, he has also organized and recruited volunteers from WellMed to do the same. As a result, Ace has led builds to complete 80 ramps in the San Antonio community. Ace describes the experience as "changing someone's life on purpose."

Ace is passing the torch to Jesse Acosta and Kimberly Dean who will continue to organize monthly builds. Jesse, who has participated in 40 builds himself, will lead on build days and Kimberly will coordinate volunteers and join the builds as time permits.

The WellMed Charitable Foundation also contributes financially to the Texas Ramp Project and has donated more than \$100,000 since 2017 to fund 200 ramp builds across Texas. Grants are made possible by WellMed employees who donate to the WellMed Charitable Foundation.
